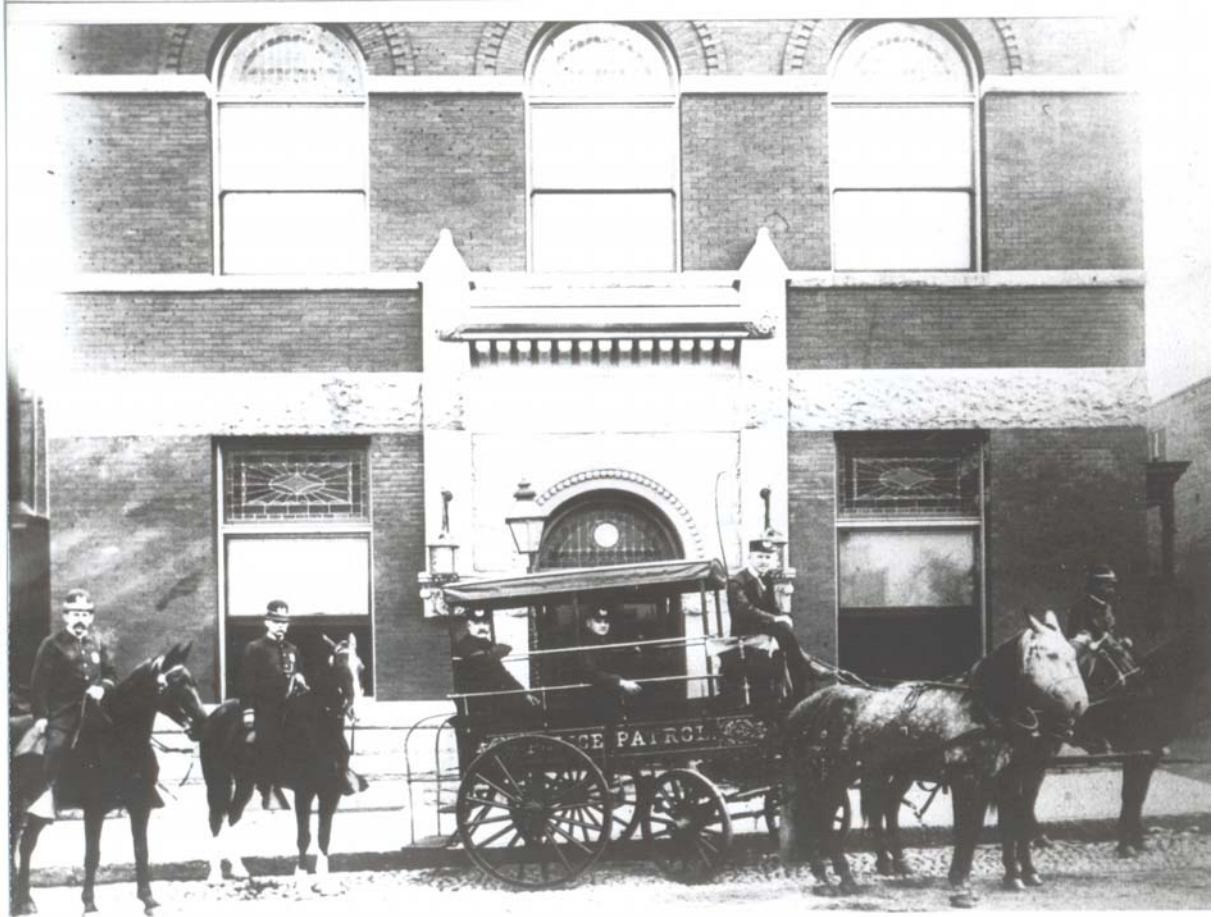


OLD CINCINNATI POLICE BUILDINGS REV 7-26-07

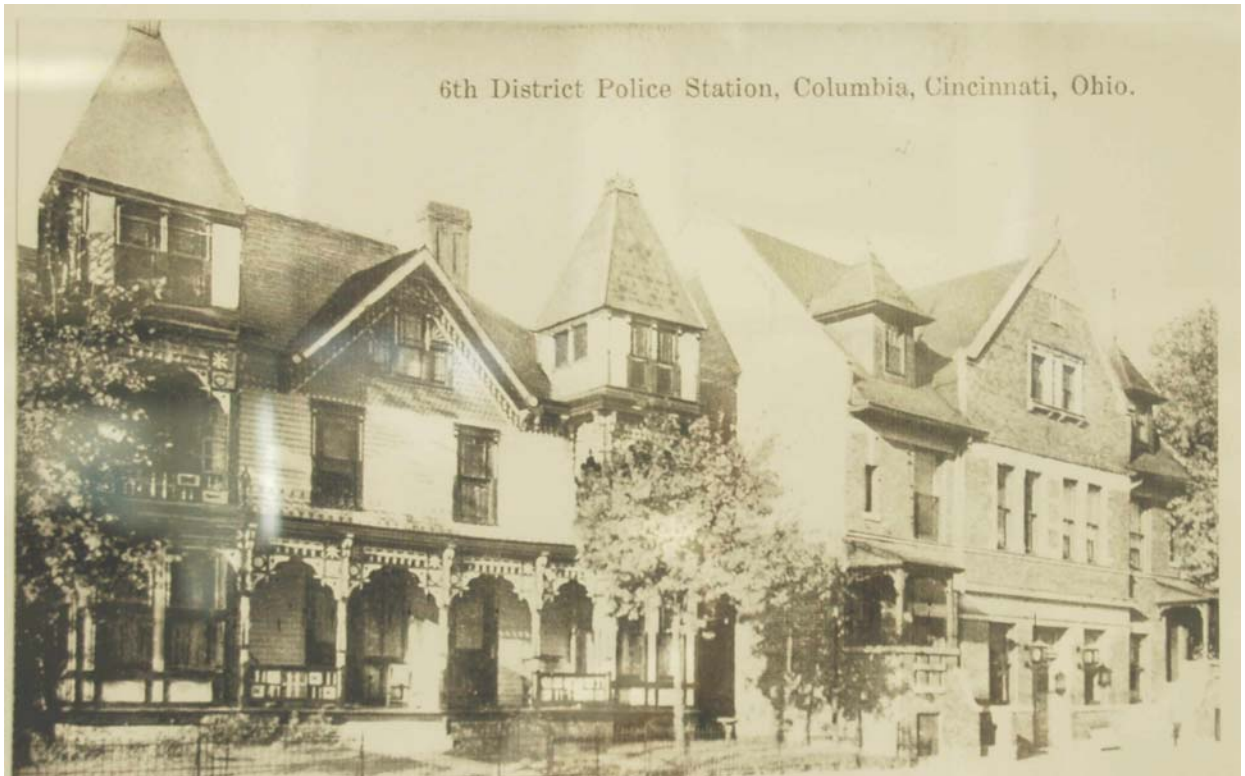

DISTRICT 3, WARSAW AVENUE, BUILT 1907, IN USE 2006.

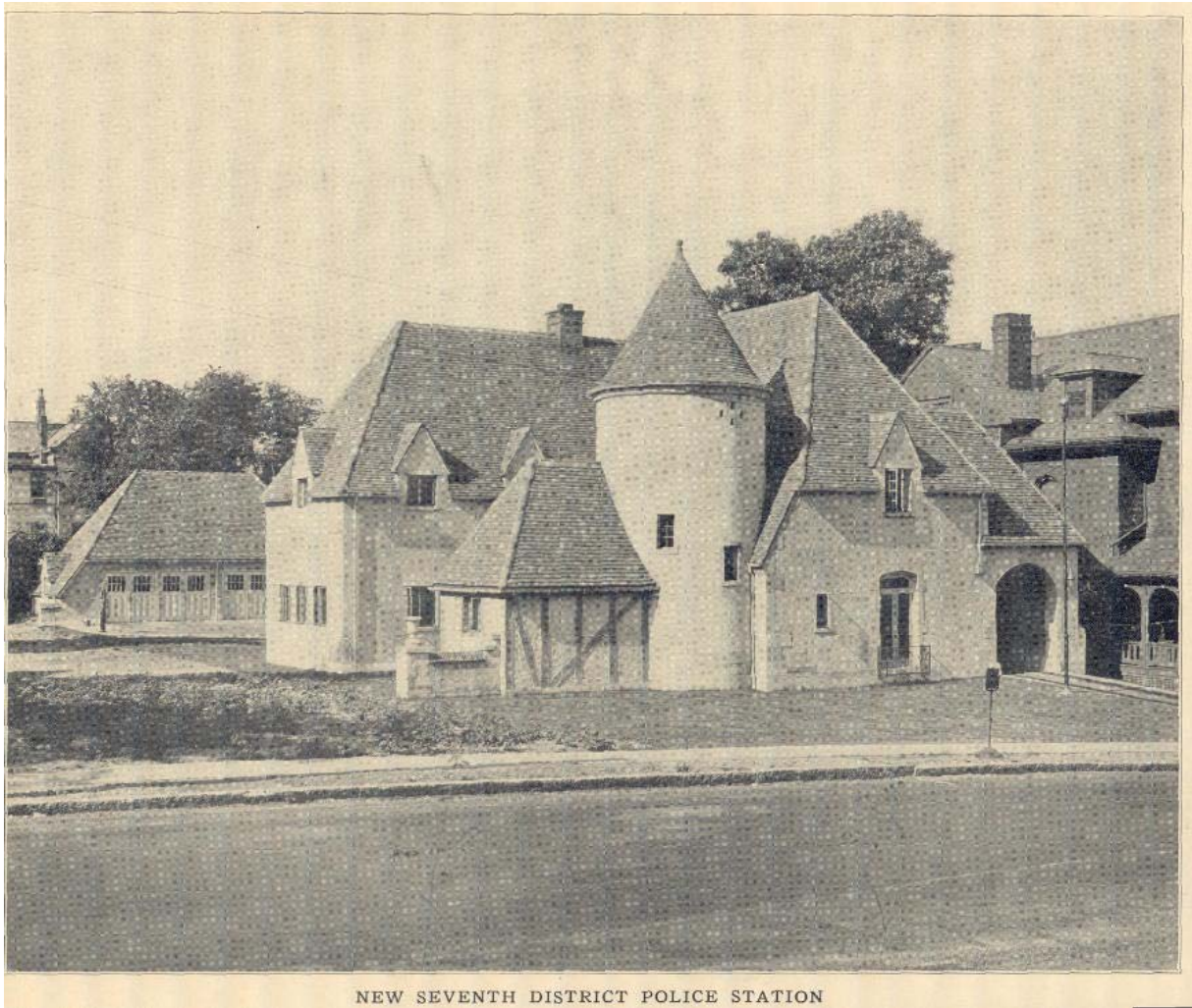


**DISTRICT 4 (BUILT IN 1893), 754 WEST FIFTH STREET,
DISTRICT 4 MOVED TO 7017 VINE STREET IN CARTHAGE
IN 1955.**



DISTRICT 6 (BUILT IN 1899), 3855 EASTERN AVENUE, USED UNTIL 1948 AND WAS RELOCATED AT THE OLD PATROL 6 HOUSE AT COLUMBIA AND DELTA AVENUES. THE NEW DISTRICT 6 OPENED IN LATE 1950 AT 3295 ERIE AVENUE AND PATROL 6 WAS CLOSED. DISTRICT 6 WAS RENAMED DISTRICT 2 IN 1975.

AS OF 1975 A NEW DISTRICT NUMBERING SYSTEM WENT INTO EFFECT. DUE TO CONSOLIDATIONS, THE DISTRICTS BECAME 1, 2, 3, 4 AND 5. DISTRICT'S 6 AND 7 DID NOT EXIST BY THEIR OLD DESIGNATIONS.



NEW SEVENTH DISTRICT POLICE STATION

DISTRICT 7, 813 BEECHER STREET, WALNUT HILLS, BUILT IN 1930. THIS BUILDING CLOSED IN 1975. DISTRICTS 4 AND 7 MERGED INTO ONE BUILDING LOCATED AT READING AND VICTORY PARKWAY. THE NEW STATION WAS KNOWN AS DISTRICT 4.



THE 1905 ANNUAL REPORT STATES THAT PATROL HOUSE 8 (BUILT 1895) WAS LOCATED AT MCMILLAN AND RAVINE STREETS.

THE PATROL HOUSE WAS DESCRIBED AS NEW BUILDING CONTAINING THE MODERN IMPROVEMENTS, BUT ON ACCOUNT OF ITS LOCATION IS POORLY ADAPTED TO OUR SERVICE AND SHOULD BE ABANDONED. A NEW HOUSE ERECTED IN A MORE SUITABLE LOCATION AS NEAR TO THE STATION HOUSE AS POSSIBLE. (THE 8TH DISTRICT STATION WAS AT 2616 VINE STREET.

'OOTING' IS THE ISS

REMEMBER WHEN—?



THE first police patrol, introduced in Cincinnati in 1880, was very crude when compared with the covered vehicles which followed and the present police auto. It was driven by a single horse. The first patrol house was established in a two-story building on Eighth-st. near Plum, on the present site of the Union Gas and Electric Co. station. Some officials of older Cincinnati are shown in the above picture of the first patrol and first patrol house. Seated in the

wagon, left to right, are: Police Telephone Operator Devine, Anthony Corry, Charles Hudson and Joseph Wuest. On the driver's seat are: John Ambrose and James Dunn. Standing in front of the wagon are, left to right: Dr. Armstrong, police surgeon; William Devine, inspector of police; Colonel Riley, police chief; Mayor William Means and Mr. Armstrong. The latter was the originator of the police patrol in Cincinnati. J. J. Corry of the Cal Crim Detective Bureau loaned the picture for reproduction in The Post's series of old Cincinnati scenes.

The present force assigned to District No. 6 (Fulton), District No. 7 (Walnut Hills), District No. 8 (Mt. Auburn), District No. 9 (Sedamsville, Price Hill, and territory west of the Mill Creek), and District No. 10 (Cumminsville), is not sufficient, and should be increased by assigning at least six additional patrolmen to each of the mentioned districts.

Should it prove to be a false alarm and the policeman is not needed, there is no harm done. Call again under similar circumstances.

THE 1955 ANNUAL REPORT STATES THAT IN 1951 THE MOTOR PATROL BUREAU HAD BEEN DISBANDED IN 1951. ALL PERSONNEL WERE REASSIGNED.

NOTE IN 1955 DISTRICT 1 MOVED TO A NEW BUILDING LOCATED AT 310 LINCOLN PARK DRIVE (THE STREET HAS BEEN RENAMED EZZARD CHARLES DRIVE).

DISTRICT 5 MOVED FROM 3478 COLERAIN AVENUE TO 1024 YORK STREET IN 1955. IN DECEMBER OF 1957 THE YORK STEET STATION WAS CLOSED AND DISTRICT 5 MOVED TO A NEW BUILDING LOCATED AT 1012 LUDLOW AVE.
