
Life Magazine Visits The Cincinnati Police Department in 1957.

Shown here are photos taken by Life Magazine. Not all of the photos taken were used in the magazine. The city was divided into 7 police districts. A central unit of detectives investigated all major crimes.

In 1955 District 1 moved to a new building located at 310 Lincoln Park Drive (the street was later renamed as Ezzard Charles Drive). Detective Headquarters remained in the basement of city hall.














