Patrolman Jerry L. Daily, P-90 (1938-2017)

Jerry was born February 28, 1938. He attended Hughes High School, graduating in 1956.

After high school, Jerry served for 8 years in the Army National Guard of Ohio, United States Army Reserve, and the United States Air Force Reserve.



Jerry joined the Cincinnati Police Division as a Police Cadet on April 15, 1958 and was assigned to Central Station (City Jail) in the basement of City Hall. He was promoted to Police Recruit on October 12, 1959 and to Patrolman on February 3, 1960. He was issued Badge Number 90 and assigned to District 5 (Ludlow Avenue).
