

Deputy Glenn C. Horn (1929-2017)

Glenn was born October 30, 1929 in Cincinnati, the 6th of 8 children born to house painter, Peter, and Loraine Horn. He graduated from Western Hills Night School during June 1950.

Also during June 1950, North Korea invaded South Korea and 2 months later, on August 8, 1950, Glenn enlisted in the United States Army. He shipped out to Korea on March 1, 1951. Forty-seven days later, on April 16, 1951, PFC Horn was wounded in the left arm. He was evacuated to a hospital in Kobe, Japan for recuperation. He returned to the war and was wounded again. He was honorably discharged with two Purple Hearts.



Back at home, Glenn joined the Cincinnati Sewage Disposal Department on November 9, 1953. He took a position in the Cincinnati Recreation Commission during 1956 and then another in the Park Department in 1966.

On February 28, 1971 Glenn resigned to take an appointment as a Deputy for the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office. Deputy Horn served the next 16 years in the Court Services Division. He retired during 1987 with 38 years of service to his country, city, and county.

Deputy Horn passed away at the VA Medical Center on January 31, 2017. He was 87.

He was predeceased by his wife, Rita (Korte) Horn (2009) and nephew, Cincinnati Police Specialist Daniel Mazzaro (2009). Deputy Horn is survived by his children, Hamilton County Corrections Officer Glenn (Stacy) Horn, Jr., Pete Horn, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Fiscal Officer Kevin (Kimberly) Horn, and Jesse Horn; grandchildren, Justin, Dean, and Zack; brothers, Phil Horn and Pete Horn (Retired Chief Deputy Clerk of the Auto Title); and niece, Cincinnati Sergeant Kathy Horn (Retired).
