

Dispatcher Robert J. George (1956 – 2017)

Bob was born on July 10, 1956 to Robert E. and Jane C. George. He graduated from St. Xavier High School and Xavier University.



After high school Bob worked for Kings Island as a parking attendant and in security from 1973 to 1976. From 1977 to 1978, he worked in their Clown Band. He then worked a stint at WMRN Radio in Marion, Ohio.

He joined the Silverton Police Department as a Dispatcher. Then, in 1988, he joined the Hamilton County Communications Center. He retired 24 years later in 2012.

After retirement, he worked as a customer service representative and dispatch for Federal Express. Having retired in Seminole Florida, he became a Pro-Life advocate who after moving to Florida spend much of his time counseling prospective abortion victims' mothers.

On April 8, 2017, Bob suffered a massive stroke and rushed to Northside Hospital in St. Petersburg, Florida. Late that evening, medics could discern no brain function. At 10:35 a.m. on April 10, 2017, with family at his side, he passed away.

Bob is survived by his children, Jessica M. Georg, Zachary R. George, Catherine M. Kappa, and Paula J. Hutchinson and granddaughter, Averi S. Veit.

A memorial Mass will be celebrated at 7 p.m. on Monday, July 10, 2017 at Old St. Mary's Church, 123 E. 13th Street, Cincinnati, OH 45202.
