

Patrolman Paul Gregory Bohman (1929-2017)

Paul was born September 26, 1929 to photo engraver Paul B. and Marcella L. Bohman of Rosemont Avenue in Delhi Township. He attended St. Aloysius Grade School and Elder High School, graduating in 1947.

He served in the United States Naval Reserve during February 1949. On February 12, 1951, Seaman Bohman was called up the United States Navy. He first served at the United States Naval Security Department in Jacksonville. He transferred to the USS Leary (DDR-879) as a Legal Yeoman, mostly in the Mediterranean Sea. He then did two tours of temporary duty in the Naval Shore Patrol in Italy (1953) and Holland (1954). Yeoman 3rd Class Bohman was honorably discharged January 25, 1955 with Good Conduct, American Defense, and Navy Occupation medals.



On January 9, 1956, Paul joined the Cincinnati Police Division as a Recruit. On April 16, 1956, he was promoted to Patrolman, issued Badge No. 58, and assigned to District 1 (310 Lincoln Park Drive). Within 2¾ years, he had two letters of appreciation and commendation, including one from Police Chief Stanley Schrotel.

On September 29, 1959, Patrolman Bohman resigned from the department to become a Game Warden for the Ohio State Division of Wildlife.



He then joined the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office as a Patrolman on the road patrol on January 21, 1965. During March 1967, Deputy Bohman was one of five officers who qualified for the first County pistol team. Also during 1967 he was appointed Detective. During November 1969, he returned to Patrol. On September 1, 1970, Patrolman Bohman and two other officers foiled a Colerain Township bank robbery and was commended by FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover. He retired September 19, 1984 with 35½ years of service to his country and communities. He then joined the United States Marshal Service.

He was predeceased by his wife of 61 years, Margie (Krisch) Bohman. Patrolman Bohman is survived by his children, Terri (John) Brickner, Michael (Linda) Bohman, and Cindy (Tom) Andres; grandchildren, Robert (Amanda) Bohman, Jodi Andres, Shauna (Nick) MacGill, and David Bohman; great-grandchildren James Bohman, Lana MacGill, and Gerard MacGill; and siblings, Thomas Bohman, Gretchen Knecht, and Mark Bohman.
